# On Dwelling with Jesus

If Advent is the season of preparation, and Christmas is the season of Incarnation, then perhaps Epiphanytide, is the season of dwelling. Incarnation, of course, means becoming flesh. It is the fancy, church-y word for what we celebrate at Christmas, the miracle of Jesus becoming human. Which is why it might make sense that the Christmas season ends with the visit of the Wise Men, who came from afar, only to gaze in wonder, and then, they move on. And our readings move on. The season after Epiphany is usually filled with readings in which Jesus begins his ministry, encounters people, and dwells with them.

We recently welcomed a new cat, Joey into our house. This was a few weeks after we had welcomed Lou's sons to visit for Thanksgiving. The preparations could not have been more different.

Thanksgiving guests unleashed a flurry of preparation: vacuuming the house from top to bottom, finding the good towels, running to buy bacon and eggs and other breakfast foods that we would never eat when it's just the two of us, and so on. All to welcome our visitors, who would dwell among us if only for a week. But then they left us. And we did the laundry and put the towels away, ate stale leftovers, and started letting the newspapers stack up on the coffee tables again.

We had a little less time to prepare for Joey the Cat. But the preparation was also very different. In part, this was because we already had another cat. Cats aren't always excited about sharing their homes (neither are humans, to be honest). But the preparations were also different,

because we were welcoming one who would live with us, hopefully forever.

The first few days we had to get used to each other. We set up a "safe space" for Joey—the spare bedroom, where we put his carrier and his bed, his food, his water, and a litter box just for him. The first day, he was welcome to explore the house, with us watching carefully, in case any problems occurred. The first night, he spent in his safe space, with the door closed, so we didn't have to worry about any tussles with other cats during the night. But to keep him from being alone, I slept in that spare room, too.

Over time, Joey became more comfortable. So that now, with the notable exception of kitchen counters and tables, the cat is welcome almost everywhere. And, for that matter, so is Francesca, our other cat. They have full access to who we are—they wander through our closets, our bedrooms. The cats know where I hid my Christmas presents and lots of other things besides, the things that visitors and guests don't see.

As we enter the season after Epiphany, where would you imagine dwelling with Jesus? Do you need a safe space to meet him, until you feel comfortable? Or is Jesus welcome in the mess-free, cleaned up, presentable parts of your life? This is an invitation, to deepen that relationship. Because God isn't a short-term house guest who needs to be impressed before returning to a separate house or Temple. God is the Creator of us All, who longs to dwell among us and show us the depths of unconditional love.

### **Christian Symbol: Latin Cross**

The Latin cross is the simplest and most common form of the Christian cross, possibly dating from the second or third century. Roman Catholic and Orthodox

Christians typically display a crucifix—an image of Jesus hanging on the cross—to remember his death for the sake of the world. Protestant churches often favor the empty cross, commemorating Jesus' resurrection.




There's a growing need for pet food in our community. If you would like to donate, place your dog food, cat food, or dog biscuits in the black
