Dear people of Christ Church,

In my sermon on Jan. 28th, I spoke about some of the "demons" that challenge us and pull us further away from God's will for our lives. Perfectionism, jealousy, shame, a need for control, fear of change.... We all have them. Perhaps Lent can be a time to intentionally contemplate and name our personal "demons" and make space for the Holy Spirit to assist us in transforming our lives. Whatever it is that sometimes "possesses" you, I invite you to explore how God's love can transform you and lessen your "demon's" pull. If you would like to talk with me about this, please let me know. I will be doing the same exploration myself!

This year is the 13th anniversary of the Springfield Peace Center's fundraiser, "The Sweetness of Peace." This event will take place Sunday, February 11th from 2 to 4 PM. The "celebration will be held in 105 Shouvlin on Wittenberg University's campus.

Sponsored by the Springfield Peace Center, all proceeds go toward "sponsoring" children for the annual Peace Camp in June. This 32nd annual Peace Camp is a community service provided free to the first 225 children who register.

Prominent area caterers will donate desserts. Admission is \$15, which will allow you samples of 10 different desserts. The Springfield Youth Symphony Orchestra will provide entertainment and door prizes will be provided. Peace and Patches Quilting Group


After more than thirty years, the quilting group is calling it
