Holy Week Is Coming!

Palm Sunday, March 25 The Liturgy of the Palms 8 AM and 10 AM

On this first day of Holy Week, we will begin each service outside the East Entrance (weather permitting) for a brief Liturgy of the Palms and

procession into the church. Each service also includes the reading of the full Passion Gospel. An Adult Formation session on the traditional celebration of the Jewish Passover at the time of Jesus will follow the 10 am service.

Wednesday, March 28th 10 AM

The usual midweek Holy Eucharist and Prayers for Healing in the chapel will include readings appointed for the Wednesday in Holy Week, and a reflection on Christ's journey to the cross.

Maundy Thursday, March 29th 6 PM in the Parish Hall

On Maundy Thursday, we celebrate the institution of the Lord's Supper, the night when Jesus shared bread and wine with his friends and commanded us to do the

same in remembrance of him. We gather in the Parish Hall for a simple meal that includes the prayers and scripture readings for the day, along with (optional) foot washing, and Holy Eucharist. At the close of the meal, we process to the church together by candlelight for the stripping of the altar. We leave the church

silently in darkness.


Good Friday March 30th, 7 Рм

On this most somber occasion, we recall the day of our Lord's execution. The Good Friday liturgy includes the full Passion Gospel, the Solemn Collects, and the Veneration of the Cross.

Easter, April 1st The Day of the Resurrection 8 and 10 AM

On this holiest day of the Christian year, we rejoice at Christ's victory over the powers of death with a quiet Holy Eucharist at 8 am and a Festive Holy Eucharist with music at 10 am. Following the 10 am

service, adults, children, and youth will celebrate together with a "Triple Egg Hunt" -- stay tuned for more details!

Dear people of Christ Church,

Question: What is YOUR passion for ministry?

Like many of you, I was spellbound by Bishop Breidenthal's words in both his sermon and his Adult Formation presentation on February 25th. The Bishop has a knack for discerning vitally important truths and questions and articulating them in an inviting and accessible way. When he met with the clergy, vestry, and wardens at the end of his time with us, he asked each person in the room to answer a single question—what is your passion for ministry? In other words, what part of the wider life of the church gets you excited, where/how do you love to serve?

The answers from the folks around the table inspired me. Each person's response was unique based on his/her gifts and values and experience, and yet all of the responses combined made a beautiful picture of what Christ Church is and can be. So now, I want to turn the question to all of you -- what is YOUR passion for ministry?

Do you love working with kids? making music? feeding hungry people? connecting with the homebound? studying Scripture? taking the church into the community? fellowship and relationshipbuilding?

I want to know where your passion lies! There are so many ways to serve God here at Christ Church, and my prayer is that we each may find our own special calling in the life of the church -- that place where service is not just another burden but an intentional practice of grateful joy and Christ-centered love.
