A NOTE ON RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

We have all longed for the day when we can return to the church building for worship – to see one another, to pray together, and to join in Holy Eucharist. That day has come, with some changes and precautions to assure the safety of everyone. Dawn Ivy and Angus Randolph have developed a handbook for ushers that follow diocesan safely guidelines. We ask that everyone who is ready to come back inside take your personal responsibility to protect your health and the health of others seriously. We are all aware of the basics – maintain at least 6 feet of distance from others, wear a face mask covering your nose and mouth, wash hands frequently, and stay home if you do not feel well. In addition, we ask that you:

- Register to attend worship each week. Register via email at zellerk0611@gmail.com or call the church office at 937-323-8651 by 3:00 PM on Thursday. We are capping attendance at 50 individuals (approximately 25% of our seating capacity).
- Plan to arrive at church no earlier than 9:45 AM and move directly into the nave to be seated in designated pews. The online service will be taped in the sanctuary beginning at 9:00, so no one will be admitted before 9:45.
- Unfortunately we are unable at this time to gather informally before or after services inside the building. Please exit the building immediately after the service.

During the service diocesan safely guidelines will be followed for the safe distribution of communion (bread only at this time). Details will be printed in your service bulletins.

We will continue to offer online services as long as they are needed for safety, but probably far into the future as a new way to be part of the Christ Church community. That service will be live at 9:00 AM each Sunday and posted on Facebook for later viewing.

Feline-informed Faith

I am the epitome of a "cat lady": Each of my five felines has taught me a bit about faith. As I settle into bed, Piccolo presses his body tightly against

mine. As I type, Tina sits on my lap, often reaching to rest a paw on my hand (the one on the mouse, of course!). Pumpkin cries persistently, even raising his front legs like toddler arms when he wants to be picked up. Yet, as any cat lover knows, these animals can be stubbornly aloof — at least until mealtime.

My cats' actions make me think about how intentional daily Bible reading is like pressing myself against God. When I see God's presence in nature or someone's kindness, pausing to give thanks is like reaching out to touch God's hand. When I feel needy, I can stretch my spirit toward God's embrace with an honest prayer. And when I make myself aloof — as, alas, I sometimes do — I can rejoice that God's love always calls me back, to nourish me again.



We are baptized as Christians; we are confirmed or received as Episcopalians. We make a decision to follow Christ in the context of a particular tradition. Those who were once confirmed in another liturgical tradition are not confirmed, but received into the church.

The Diocese of Southern Ohio is offering confirmation instruction via Zoom for anyone interested in confirmation or reception this spring or simply interested in learning more about the church. The class will be taught on Tuesday in Eastertide from 7-8:30 PM and recorded for viewing at other times. To register go to

- **3.** When asked for your Participant ID Number press #
- **4.** When asked for your password, enter **712122**#

NOTE: if you don't hear anything right away, don't panic. Sometimes we run a few minutes late, so just hang on and trust that we'll begin as soon as we can.

African Bible Study Wednesday at 7 PM

African Bible Study meets each Wednesday via Google Meet. The African bible study now has a permanent URL for Google Meet for meetings, meet.google.com/nwt-cfge-txd

What is African Bible Study? The approach used is sometimes called African Bible Study, which refers to the method's origins. It is a very structured, very disciplined, and very meditative approach to learning from scripture. It not only discourages but prevents crosstalk and intellectualizing on a reading. It instead encourages listening to others and ourselves as opposed to talking as a group.

THE FORMAT

Opening Prayer: O Blessed Lord, who caused all Holy Scripture to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life,

which you have given us in our savior Jesus Christ, Amen.

Procedure:

- 1. One person reads passage slowly.
- 2. Each person identifies the word or phrase that catches their attention. (1 minute)
- 3. Each shares the word or phrase with the group. (3-5 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
- 4. Another person reads the passage slowly (from a different translation, if possible.)
- 5. Each person identifies where this passage touches their life today. (1 minute)
- 6. Each shares. (3-5 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
- 7. Passage is read a third time (another reader and translation, if possible.)
- 8. Each person names or writes: "From what I've heard and shared, what do I believe God wants me to do or be? Is God inviting me to change in any way?" (5 minutes)
- 9. Each shares their answer. (5-10 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
- 10. Each prays for the person on their right, naming what was shared in other steps. (5 minutes)

Closing: The Lord's Prayer

In Gratitude for Thomas Breidenthal, kind shepherd and fierce leader during his years as Bishop of Southern Ohio...

Manus Dei

The diffident beauty of hands work-worn, well-scrubbed, small, large, pale or dark, some trembling, replaces the usual chorus of faces as priest and deacon move again and again across the altar rail, sharing the mystery of the faith in sacraments of bread and wine. Palms opened upward, the lifeline traced in a curve like moonrise, fingers slightly curled, some crooked, some tapering, blue tracery of veins in the wrist like rivers stirring under spring snow—such ordinary beauty. Recalling his years of ministry the bishop remembers the hands more than processions or candles or the sunlight blazing through stained-glass windows.
