A NOTE ON RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP

We have all longed for the day when we can return to the church building for worship – to see one another, to pray together, and to join in Holy Eucharist. That day has come, with some changes and precautions to assure the safety of everyone. Dawn Ivy and Angus Randolph have developed a handbook for ushers that follow diocesan safely guidelines. We ask that everyone who is ready to come back inside take your personal responsibility to protect your health and the health of others seriously. We are all aware of the basics – maintain at least 6 feet of distance from others, wear a face mask covering your nose and mouth, wash hands frequently, and stay home if you do not feel well. In addition, we ask that you:

- Register to attend worship each week. Register via email at zellerk0611@gmail.com or call the church office at 937-323-8651 by 3:00 PM on Thursday. We are capping attendance at 50 individuals (approximately 25% of our seating capacity).
- Plan to arrive at church no earlier than 9:45 AM and move directly into the nave to be seated in designated pews. The online service will be taped in the sanctuary beginning at 9:00, so no one will be admitted before 9:45.
- Unfortunately we are unable at this time to gather informally before or after services inside the building. Please exit the building immediately after the service.

During the service diocesan safely guidelines will be followed for the safe distribution of communion (bread only at this time). Details will be printed in your service bulletins.

We will continue to offer online services as long as they are needed for safety, but probably far into the future as a new way to be part of the Christ Church community. That service will be live at 9:00 AM each Sunday and posted on Facebook for later viewing.

Above all else, we want you to feel safe as we enter this new phase of our lives together. If you have any questions or concerns at all, contact Senior Warden Dawn Ivy at dvivy0960@yahoo.com or Canon Lee Anne Reat at lareat@diosohio.org or 614-214-4236.

Below are instructions for calling in via telephone to listen to the audio of our virtual Sunday morning service.

- **1.** A few minutes before 9:00 AM, call **312-626-6799**. A recording will answer, saying "Welcome to Zoom!"
- 2. It will ask you to enter your Meeting ID, followed by #. That's **841 1414 5583**#
- **3.** When asked for your Participant ID Number press #
- **4.** When asked for your password, enter **712122#** Now you'll be able to hear our worship!

NOTE: if you don't hear anything right away, don't panic. Sometimes we run a few minutes late, so just hang on and trust that we'll begin as soon as we can.

What is African Bible Study? The approach used is sometimes called African Bible Study, which refers to the method's origins. It is a very structured, very disciplined, and very meditative approach to learning from scripture. It not only discourages but prevents crosstalk and intellectualizing on a reading. It instead encourages listening to others and ourselves as opposed to talking as a group.

THE FORMAT

Opening Prayer: O Blessed Lord, who caused all Holy Scripture to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life,

which you have given us in our savior Jesus Christ, Amen.

Procedure:

- 1. One person reads passage slowly.
- 2. Each person identifies the word or phrase that catches their attention. (1 minute)
- 3. Each shares the word or phrase with the group. (3-5 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
- 4. Another person reads the passage slowly (from a different translation, if possible.)
- 5. Each person identifies where this passage touches their life today. (1 minute)
- 6. Each shares. (3-5 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
- 7. Passage is read a third time (another reader and translation, if possible.)
- 8. Each person names or writes: "From what I've heard and shared, what do I believe God wants me to do or be? Is God inviting me to change in any way?" (5 minutes)
- 9. Each shares their answer. (5-10 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
- 10. Each prays for the person on their right, naming what was shared in other steps. (5 minutes)

Closing: The Lord's Prayer

Wednesday Food Pantry Dates April 21st and May 19th

Volunteers are needed before and on drive through pantry days to help unload food, pack food and provide customer service. No matter your level of comfort with in-person contact, there is a volunteer opportunity that's right for you!

Currently, food pantry groceries are being prebagged so that on pantry distribution day, filled bags can be placed into client's cars. This has created an opportunity for you to volunteer as a pantry helper with little to no contact with other individuals. It is also an opportunity for your family or "pod" to volunteer bagging groceries. Ann Chitkara will arrange for either you or your pod to be the only group working on the project at one time.

A glimpse of the work involved: as soon as all the groceries are unloaded onto tables in the parish hall, you would go around the tables loading specific items into bags and placing the bags on specified pallets or tables where they will sit until pantry distribution day. The work also involves clearing out and breaking down cardboard shipping boxes.

We are currently seeking packing volunteers for May. (A big thanks to all who volunteered in April!) Please look at your calendar. If you and or your pod are willing to commit to a block of 3–4 hours on either May 13th, May 14th, or possibly May 15th, please let Ann know. Together you can arrange a time when Ann will meet you at the Church and provide specific directions. Ideally, all the groceries should be bagged for distribution by May 19th.

Anticipating Life's Waves

Joni Eareckson Tada, who was paralyzed after a diving accident, described swimming in the ocean as a child. Because the waves looked so high, her first inclination was to swim away from them. That, however, just left her tossed about and sometimes held underwater. "The best thing," she discovered, "was to swim fast *toward* [the waves] and dive *under* them before they had a chance to break on top of you."

That's true with life's "waves of crisis or difficulty" too, says Tada. "The best way to beat those waves

of trials and tough challenges is to *face* them. Head-on. Almost anticipating them. Sometimes I find myself literally diving into the middle of a problem before it has a chance to crash on top of me." When problems are about to break on top of you, what helps you face them and stand your ground?
