Growing a Rector

Dear Christ Church Friends,

This spring, a long-held dream came true: raised beds for our back yard. I have always loved the idea of vegetable gardening, and always been frustrated by the reality of it. In Toledo, we had too much shade and way too many deer, who treated any effort at vegetables as their personal salad bar. In Detroit, we had the tiniest of yards. It was either swings for the kids, or a garden, and of course the swings won.

Now—maybe—I finally might grow something. Maybe. I'm planting herbs and tomatoes, beans and peppers, and I'm putting each in the ground with a "Don't fail me now" kind of prayer! But also with a lot of curiosity. That spindly tomato plant—when will it bear fruit? Those beans—when will we pick some for dinner?

I know that all of us are asking the same question about the new rector: When? When will there be an announcement? When will he or she arrive? These are the dates we know:

- June 5: Deadline for the diocese to receive applications
- June 20: Search Committee meets with the Rev. Lynn Carter-Edmands to receive the names
- July 5–15: Skype interviews, possibly followed by a second interview
- August: visits by Search Committee teams to the likeliest candidates and background checks

Then the finalists will visit here and meet with the Bishop. The Committee will recommend a priest to the Vestry, who will extend a call. If accepted, the person will give notice (6 weeks is customary) to their current parish.

But just as my vegetables' timetable will be affected by the amount of rain and sun we receive and by how chilly or hot the weather is, the timing of this search will be affected by factors we don't know about yet. If a candidate is going to be on vacation in August, for example, that could either hasten or delay the Search Committee's visit.

I've had the privilege of meeting with the Search Committee, and I am so impressed with the care and diligence they are putting into their work. You could not be in better hands. Our job is to pray for them—and to enjoy this summer together.

Almighty God, giver of every good gift: Look graciously on Christ Church, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a Rector for this parish, that we may receive a faithful pastor, who will care for your people and equip us for our ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Senior Warden Bonnie Shelburne announced on Sunday May 14 that the Vestry has appointed me as Stewardship Coach. It will be a privilege to work with your Stewardship Steering Committee. In fact, by the time you receive this newsletter, the committee will have had a planning retreat.

For me, Stewardship is about more than raising money to pay utility bills. It's about living into the specific mission to which God calls Christ Church in 2018. Even more, it has to do with each of us growing more deeply into the "Jesus life" of joyful open-handed generosity.

My aim is to walk with the committee as they develop a plan, a theme, and a goal for the 2017 campaign. I will support them as they implement the plan and help them evaluate it when it is done. In this way, I hope that Christ Church will have a Stewardship approach that can be replicated in years to come.

An effective Stewardship Campaign takes many more people than the Steering Committee. There will come a time when a Committee member may ask you to help with some small part of it. If asked, please say "yes," if you possibly can.


Prayer shawls are available Ministry in the East Entrance. The Prayer Shawls can be given to anyone needing comfort during difficult times.
