Change

Dear friends in Christ,

Who was it who said that "the only constant is change"? I can't remember but those words have been coming to mind a lot, lately. In our parish family, we've had the joy of seeing Ian Waggoner and Sophie Smith graduate — but we know that when they leave for college we will miss them greatly.

We've recently also said goodbye to Rosie Anderson and Scott Warren, and turned them over to God's care. And in my time with you, two wonderful families have moved or will shortly move away: John, Amy and Jamie Alduino; and Ty Buckman and Jody Rambo and their children, Helena and Wyeth.

If you're like me, you're not a fan of change; you'd much rather things stay as they are.

But if we look deeply into the roots of our faith, we discover that God is always calling people to something new. In our first lessons, this summer, we'll be following the story of Abraham and Sarah, and their descendantsall the way to Moses and the Exodus.

And it seems like God is constantly saying to these ancestors, "Get up, and leave this place. Follow me, to a new place I'll show you."

Sometimes it doesn't seem fair. Abraham and Sarah were well into retirement when God called them—you'd think he would have chosen someone younger! Sometimes it was downright scary. Jacob, a teenager with bad judgment, found himself alone in the wilderness at night, with only a rock for a pillow and a lot of hungry-sounding animals, all around.

But then he heard God speak: "Jacob, I am with you, and will keep you wherever you go." That's what they all discovered: wherever they went, God was there. They never walked into empty newness, but always into the arms of God.

So do we.


WIPrayer shawls are available

Exodus: Diocese of Southern Ohio's Big Read

Some communities have a "Big Read", where everyone is encouraged to read and discuss the same book.

Bishop Breidenthal has asked all of us in this diocese to read and discuss the same book of the Bible: *Exodus*. It is a timely choice. As the Bishop writes, "We are at a moment as a church and a culture when the questions that the Book of *Exodus* raises are prominent. What does it mean to be a stranger in a strange land? What does it mean to leave behind all the things we thought we knew? What does it mean to see our communities change?"

We'll begin our "Big Read" on August 27, with a sermon on *Exodus*. We'll continue it at the Adult Forums this fall, as we explore this powerful story, not only by studying the text, but also through art, and perhaps music. 


