Nursery Reopens!

We are very happy to announce the reopening of the Nursery Room for an infant "Quiet Room". We have equipped the room with a new Pack & Play crib and a changing table with fresh supplies.

The door to the room will remain open during all services. To start with there will not be any nursery attendants, so a parent would need to be present with an infant or small child. If attendants are provided, we are required to always have two attendants and they must be trained in "Safe Church" requirements. We will be rehiring attendants in the future as the usage of the Nursery increases. Christ Church loves new babies! Parents, please take note that the sound of a baby in church is always a Joyful Noise!

Note on Communion

We have considered possible alternative methods of communion. We have found that our diocese recommendation is for use of the common cup in lieu of intinction, while other Episcopal dioceses are recommending intinction in lieu of the common cup. Each diocese has different medical advisors, so it is obvious that there is no medical consensus on this subject. We have decided to accept and accommodate either common cup or intinction at the discretion of each parishioner. You are welcome to receive communion as you see best. *Looking forward to seeing you at church!*

More About Volunteering

Currently, food pantry groceries are being prebagged so that on distribution day, filled bags can be placed into client's cars. This has created an opportunity for you to volunteer as a pantry helper with little to no contact with other individuals. It's also an opportunity for your family or "pod" to work together to bag groceries. Ann Chitkara will arrange for either you or your pod to be the only group working on the project at one time, if you so desire.

Check your calendar to see if you and/or your pod can commit to a block of 3-4 hours on July 14 and/or August 11. Ann C. will meet you at the Church and provide specific instructions. Ideally, all groceries should be bagged for distribution by July 20th and August 17th. East High Street Churches Walking Tour Saturday, July 23, 2022 10:00 – 11:30 AM

Springfield's houses of worship serve as anchors in the revitalization of our historic neighborhoods. The East High Street Historic District is home to three landmark churches close to downtown:

- Christ Episcopal Church, designed by the eminent Detroit architect Gordon W. Lloyd (1874);
- **High Street United Methodist Church,** one of Frank Packard's best examples of the Craftsman Style (1904); and
 - the spectacular **St. Raphael Catholic Church**, designed by local architect Charles A. Cregar.

Join historian Kevin Rose as he delves into the history and architecture of these ecclesiastical landmarks.

The cost is \$15 for the general public, \$12 for the Westcott members. We will meet outside of Christ Church, 409 East High Street at 10 AM.
