## African Bible Study Returns September 5<sup>th</sup>

Join us on Tuesdays at 12 PM

African Bible Study or Sacred Reading (Lectio Divina) will begin again Tuesday, September 5th at 12 PM. We will meet each week at noon using an established Zoom link. This Bible study is a structured, meditative approach to learning about our Christian faith from scripture. It not only discourages but also disallows crosstalk during the collective reading. It encourages self-reflection as well as listening to others.

We hope people who are interested will join us in this empowering group study of scripture. ### Outline of African Bible Study or Lectio Divina

Opening Prayer: O Blessed Lord, who caused all Holy Scripture to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our savior Jesus Christ, Amen.

#### Procedure:

1. One person reads passage slowly.
2. Each person identifies the word or phrase that catches their attention. (1 minute)
3. Each shares the word or phrase with the group. (3-5 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
4. Another person reads the passage slowly (from a different translation, if possible.)
5. Each person identifies where this passage touches their life today. (1 minute)
6. Each shares. (3-5 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
7. Passage is read a third time (another reader and translation, if possible.)
8. Each person names or writes: "From what I've heard and shared, what do I believe God wants me to do or be? Is God inviting me to change in any way?" (5 minutes)
9. Each shares their answer. (5-10 minutes, NO DISCUSSION)
10. Each prays for another person in the group, naming what was shared in other steps. (5 minutes)

Closing: The Lord's Prayer

There are several issues that we'll be looking at in the near future to improve the physical church building.

- With the recent excessive rains, we have had a problem with water coming into the basement near the Chapel. Runoff collects between the church and Hollenbeck, and a footer drain is clogged near the East Entrance. We need to install some surface yard drains to capture that surface runoff. It will likely require some trenching to open the clogged line and add the drains in the area of the garden.
- We purchased organ pipes two decades ago but never installed them. We have a wonderful concert Skinner organ, and it is time to put the pipes in place so that the organ can operate as it was intended. The organ is an ongoing project, but this step must be done in the next two years as our organ repair company, which has been graciously storing them at no cost, has asked us to take possession of our pipes.
- Our Sexton reports that the gas line is again hooked up to the stove and that it can be used again.
- Finally, the Wescott House planned an architectural tour of our church along with St. Raphael and High Street Methodist churches. We were ready to receive the guests, but a thunderstorm was forecast, and the walking tour was cancelled. It may be rescheduled later in the Fall.

The Warder Literacy CENTER is opening on a limited basis & there will be a growing need for their services given that kids have been out of school (some without access to computers) and will need to play catch up.




The Dayton Ronald McDonald House has re-opened its 14 guest-room house to provide a safe, home-like environment where families with sick and

### How Pre-Bagging Works


