

If you desire prayer for any reason, simply state your concern. You will be anointed with Holy Oil and the Trinitarian blessing followed by prayer. You will receive a card during the week with the message that you will continue to be remembered in prayer.

Bishop Breidenthal has asked Episcopalians around the Diocese to read the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles together this year, beginning in Advent and lasting until the Day of Pentecost (early June). Judy Johnson will help us kick off the "Big Read" with a special Introduction to Luke/Acts in the Adult Forum on Sunday Dec. 2nd.

Later that same day, our "Big Read" Bible Study group will gather for the first time at Winans (32 N. Fountain Ave.) from 4:00 to 5:00 PM. All interested adults and youth are welcome to join us—no prior knowledge or expertise necessary!

This will be a friendly, relaxed discussion of Luke/Acts, moving through the narrative bit by bit, according to a reading schedule from the Diocese. Don't worry if you can't commit to being there every week. Just come when you can, bring a Bible if you've got one, and talk to Maggie if you have questions (RevMaggieLS@gmail.com)! Help raise funds for our Food Pantry through the **Amazon Smile Program.** This program allows us to earn 0.05% on all purchases originating from


our web site. Here are two ways to do it:
