I have a secret to tell you, and I hope you won't be too disappointed in me!

My secret is this: even as I'm typing these words, more than a week before the Season of Advent begins, I'm listening to Christmas music. Yes, I know it's early. Yes, I know it is highly improper -- liturgically speaking, of course. It's the lesser-known 11th Commandment: "Thou shalt not sing 'fa-la-la-la' before the evening of December 24th!" But I just can't help myself.

This time of year can be so busy and hectic for all of us. We're buying gifts, finalizing travel plans, filling our calendars with special events... and Advent can be especially overwhelming for those of us who work in the church. There are so many important things to be done, and not enough time to do them!

It's easy to fall into the harried and distracted patterns of our consumeroriented society, and lose all sense of the tender, holy anticipation of these days. And that's why I need my Christmas music, even now. Those words we've known by heart for so long, words of joyous celebration and awe and grateful praise, remind me just what a precious gift it is I'm waiting for.

When I'm feeling scattered and distracted, the music calls me back to what really matters -- the miracle of Incarnation. In the bright shining light of the newborn Christ, all else falls away.

May your Advent be filled with reminders of the humble glory that awaits on Christmas morn!
