





### Dear people of Christ Church,

Merry (almost) Christmas! Below is the blessing I will use at the end of the 7:30 PM service on Christmas Eve. The words are from the late great Howard Thurman, African-American theologian, author, professor, and Baptist pastor. His writings have shepherded generations of clergy and seminarians, and his Christmas blessing is used in churches spanning many different denominations:



"When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among others,
To make music in the heart."

## **Christ Church Winter Weather Policy**

If the Clark County Sheriff calls a Level 1 Snow Emergency, Christ Church will cancel the 8 am Sunday Service, the 10 AM Wednesday Chapel Service and the office, meetings and any other activities. If the Sheriff calls a Level 2 Snow Emergency the 10 AM Sunday Service will also be cancelled. # **UPDATE: Financial Support Pledged** for 2020

As of December 16th, we have received 75 pledges of financial support for next year, totaling \$187,823.44. This includes 9 new pledging units, and 22 established units who increased their pledge amounts.

# NEW KEYS ISSUED FOR EAST ENTRANCE



Due to unforeseen problems with the keyless entry system, your Vestry and Wardens, guided by the Security Director, have decided to install a brand-

new lock on the East Entrance door, and issue new keys.

When will the East entrance be re-keyed, and how do I get my key? You may sign for your new key in the East Entrance before either worship service on December 15th or 22nd, and then after Christmas we'll switch over the lock cylinders and your new key will be operational by Sunday, December 29th.

Who gets a key? The following get keys:
Springfield fire/police, clergy, Parish
Administrator, Facility Manager, Organist/Choir
Director, Vestry officers & members, Security
Director, Altar Guild members, Ushers &
Greeters, Food Pantry leaders, Coffee Hour
hosts, and Choir members. When you step
down from your role in one of these categories,
you must then return your key.

What if my category is not on the list and I need a key? If you need a temporary or permanent key, complete a "Request for Access" form you can either get from Kelly Zeller or from the church website explaining why you need a key and you'll get an answer from us in about a week.

How am I responsible for my key? The keys are sequentially numbered and can't be duplicated. By using your key you've assumed responsibility for church property. You're expected to safeguard your key and never loan it to another person. If you lose your key, you must report it immediately to the church office.
