Dear people of Christ Church,

I hope your summer is off to a wonderful start! Summer is certainly a happy time in my house... the pace of life seems to slow down a bit, with more time for relaxation and play (and we all need that, no matter our age). I pray that all of you will be able to enjoy some Sabbath time during the coming months -- whatever Sabbath looks like for you!

As we begin the Season after Pentecost (aka "Ordinary Time"), some of you will notice subtle changes to the liturgy we use during the 10:00 am service. Indeed, some of you may have already noticed! Here's the scoop: during last summer's General Convention of the Episcopal Church in Austin, Texas, both Houses of the Convention approved new, slightly-edited versions of texts from the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer*. These new versions are known as Expansive Language texts. The intent is not to alter the theology or historic continuity of our worship. Rather, the intent is to adapt our liturgical language to include more varied (and less gendered) images of God. Very few of us today would argue that the Eternal Creator of the Universe is biologically male (and also *not* female); and these Expansive Language liturgical texts are an effort to acknowledge that God is not limited to our earthly categories of sex or gender.

Although these new texts are not perfect, I do believe they are a step in the right direction. We might take the story of our own creation, Genesis 1:26-27, as our inspiration for this work:

Then God said, "Let us make humanity in our image to resemble us so that they may take charge of the fish of the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the earth, and all the crawling things on earth." God created humanity in God's own image, in the divine image God created them, male and female God created them.

Finally, on a personal note -- I was raised in a church that used expansive language to talk about God, and it wasn't until I entered seminary that I realized most of my peers had been trained to know God as fully and only male. I am grateful that I never had to feel alienated from my Creator by virtue of my gender, and I wish that same blessing for all other Christians.

If you are interested in learning more about what happened at last year's General Convention, the Episcopal News Service website is a good place to start. And if you have feedback on the texts, or want to talk about any aspect of our worship, I welcome the conversation.

May we all, regardless of gender/ethnicity/orientation/age/ability—or any other earthly category—know ourselves to be made in the perfect and all-encompassing image of God!



# Upcoming Speaker Series: Becoming Beloved Community

A consortium of Springfield congregations presents "Becoming Beloved Community: Understanding the Challenge of Racial Division in Springfield," a six-part speaker series that combines sociological, theological, and historical perspectives in an effort to better understand the lived experience of racial identities in our part of the Miami Valley.

The series begins on Sunday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, at 4 pm, at the Central Community Center (102 W. High St.) and continues each Sunday at the same time and place until August 4<sup>th</sup>. A meal will be provided following each speaker. Participation requires the completion of a registration form (available through the sponsoring congregations) and a \$20 fee.

The series includes an introduction to concepts like implicit bias and structural racism (provided by Preshuslee Thompson from Ohio State University's Kirwan Institute for the Study of Race and Ethnicity). It explains the connections between historical wrongs, our present practices, and personal spiritual formation (addressed by Rev. Sunder John Boopalan, author of *Memory, Grief, and Agency: A Political Theological Account of Wrongs and Rites*).It traces the historical foundations of present-day divisions in Springfield's history of lynching, race riots, and segregation (presented by local historian and retired prosecutor Darnell Carter and by a panel of community members). And the series concludes by considering community-based options for overcoming social divisions.

This event is made possible through the collaboration of many community members and by the support of Central Christian Church, Christ Episcopal Church, Covenant Presbyterian Church, Covenant United Methodist Church, First Baptist Church, First Lutheran Church, High St. United Methodist Church, Northminster Presbyterian Church, and St. Raphael/St. Joseph Catholic Church.
