Dear people of Christ Church,

"When can we come back to church?"

This is the question on everyone's mind these days... and the short answer is: I wish I knew!

The longer answer is more complicated. Your Clergy and Wardens and Vestry and Worship Team have been working on this for weeks. We've discussed different scenarios, asked lots of hard questions, planned for different contingencies, and studied the guidelines from the Bishop's office and the data from local public health experts. You can read the Diocesan guidelines yourself at <u>episcopaliansinconnection.org/doing-church-during-covid-19/</u> (beware, there's A LOT there!). You can also refresh your memory on the broad "Guiding Principles" your Vestry adopted unanimously back in May (included at the end of this note).

Your Vestry and Leadership Team are dedicated to a cautious, wellinformed transition that keeps our most vulnerable members as safe as possible. Given the continued spread of the novel coronavirus in Clark County, along with the reality that transmission risk is highest in enclosed spaces, I feel certain that we will not be back in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings at any point during June. My hope is that we will be able to hold Sunday services in our sanctuary again later this summer -- but of course I cannot make any promises. And whenever we are able to regather in the pews, our worship experience will be different. Masks will be required. There will be no singing. There will be no passing the offering plate, and no handshakes or hugs. There will be no sacrament of Holy Eucharist. Even when we do return to the sanctuary, much of what our hearts long for will remain absent for an unknown period of time.

We can't control any of this, and it is painful. It is painful to fast from Christ's Body and Blood; it is painful to hear the beloved hymns and not sing along; it is painful to be denied access to the comforting rhythms and routines we've always followed. But we must remember that *our God has not abandoned us*. God is present with us in this spiritual desert, just as God was present with Moses and the Israelites on their Exodus journey so long ago. Jesus promised: "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20); and *Jesus keeps his promises*. And we have received the gift of the Paraclete, the Advocate, the Holy Spirit who surrounds and inspires all of us without exception. *The Spirit is never constrained by time or distance* or any other earthly circumstance.

(Rector's Message, continued)

As of this writing (June 10th), Clark County has seen a slight but steady increase in the number of new COVID-19 cases (both confirmed and probable) over the last three weeks. You can see our local data firsthand on the Combined Health District's website at <u>www.ccchd.com</u>. Although many businesses and organizations are reopening, we're all feeling restless, and it may seem like this COVID thing is blowing over... the reality is that the virus continues to spread in our community.

In accordance with the guidelines from the Bishop's office and the responsible commitments of your Vestry, the Worship Team has begun planning for the first stage of inperson worship opportunities. We will not begin this first stage, however, until the spread of the virus slows down in Clark County.

Once we see a downward trajectory in new COVID cases for at least two consecutive weeks, we will begin offering small outdoor in-person worship services (while continuing to livestream our Sunday morning service). This might mean a Wednesday Chapel service at a local park, or an evening service of Compline in someone's backyard. Smaller outdoor worship services will be our first step back -- putting our toes in the water -- before we will consider moving to larger outdoor services and/or indoor services.

More details about these first in-person worship opportunities are coming soon. In the meantime, please continue to reach out to one another in faith and love, take advantage of our virtual offerings, and *lift up those prayers* -- for our parish, our community, our nation, and the world!

Guiding Principles for Christ Church's Return to In-Person Worship {adopted by Vestry on 5/7/20}

SAFELY + RESPONSIBLY + FAITHFULLY

- We, the congregation of Christ Episcopal Church, will prioritize the health and safety of the full Body of Christ over our personal preferences and desires to "get back to normal."
- We agree to be guided by the instructions issued by the Bishop's Office in order to limit the risks in our return to in-person worship. (Rationale: see #1)
- We agree to follow applicable guidelines from the Governor's office and/or Ohio Department of Health. <u>Note</u>: As a religious organization, we are legally exempt from most of these guidelines; but we will not take advantage of this exemption. (Rationale: see #1)
- 4. We **will maintain** 6 feet of space between all persons who do not live together. (Rationale: see #1)
- 5. We **will continue** to offer as much as we can online. (Rationale: see #1)
- 6. We **will encourage** folks at higher risk (65+ and/or underlying conditions) to stay home. (Rationale: see #1)
- We will not ask any staff members or volunteers to engage in high risk behaviors (i.e. any duties that may violate the parish/diocesan/state guidelines). (Rationale: see #1)

+ These guidelines will govern the **first stage** of our return, which begins on the date we hold our first inperson worship services (not yet known). Guidelines will be continually reevaluated by Leadership Team and Vestry.

+ Instructions from the Bishop's office will cover many specifics: communion, coffee hour, face masks, singing, etc. Our task is to discern **how we will implement these specifics** in the context of our parish.

Calling in Via Telephone for Worship Audio

Dear friends,

Here are the instructions for calling in via telephone if you'd like to listen to the audio of our online worship services on Sunday mornings. They will not change from week to week, until we begin offering in-person worship services again. (When that happens, we'll figure out another way to share audio via phone.)

Here's what you need to do:

1. A few minutes before 9:00 am on Sunday, call

1-312-626-6799.

- 2. A recording will answer, saying **"Welcome** to Zoom!"
- It will ask you to enter your Meeting ID, followed by #. Meeting ID: 88472403977#
- Then it will ask for your Participant ID Number — but you don't have one! So just press #
- Finally, it will ask you to enter the Password, followed by #. Password: 132550#
- 6. Now you will be able to hear our worship!

A special note: if you don't hear anything right away, don't panic. Sometimes we run a few minutes behind schedule due to various technical issues -- so just hang in there, and trust that we'll begin as soon as we can.

A NOTE ABOUT FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE CHURCH

We are in the midst of an anxious and uncertain time in our community and in our world. As I write these words, the many ministries of Christ Episcopal Church continue on in a variety of ways (online worship, daily meditations, pastoral care via phone, and Christian formation via text message, among others). Our Church staff have been faithful, flexible, and dedicated to serving this parish as best they can.

As a faithful community that seeks to embody passionate discipleship and a heart for Christian justice, we are also committed to continuing to pay all staff members at their usual levels, including those whose normal work duties have been restricted by the COVID-19 pandemic. And although we are currently unable to gather on site, the normal operating expenses and costs of upkeep for our historic building remain the same.

Christ Church may look and feel different right now, but we continue to be and share the good news of Jesus Christ by loving and serving our neighbors from our doorsteps to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). We invite you to support the work of the Church financially by giving in one of two ways:

"High-tech" giving: Go to the Diocesan homepage at EpiscopaliansInConnection.org, and click on *Give online to your church*. Be sure you select **Christ Church, Springfield** from the drop-down bar.

***And don't forget the Rector's Discretionary Fund: Because we've been unable to gather for inperson worship since mid-March, the Rector's Discretionary Fund has not received the "loose offering" from the 1st Sunday of April, May, or June (as it normally would). Rev. Maggie uses these funds to assist folks (from both inside and outside the parish) with basic needs like rent payments, groceries, and help with medical bills. If you'd like to make a contribution to this fund, just mail a check to Christ Episcopal Church and write "Rector's Discretionary Fund" on the memo line.
